VERY IMPORTANT**Note for importer**

- A Licence to Import is required to authorise the import of any substance covered by the Single Convention on Narcotic Drugs, 1961 and the Convention on Psychotropic Substances, 1971.
- This licence is only valid for the importer named above and may be revoked for non-compliance with the specified conditions.
- Where the laws of the exporting country require the issue of an Export Authorisation, a copy of the Export Authorisation must accompany the goods.
- The Ministry of Health should be advised if import is not proceeded with, and any copies of the licence held should be returned within seven (7) days of its expiry.
